



Copy Right

Most educators rely on being able to use copyright protected materials every day. With an Access Copyright licence, we make this possible - quickly and legally, and ensure that publishers and creators are fairly compensated when their works are copied instead of purchased.

Through agreements with other copyright organizations around the world - such as those in the U.S., U.K., Australia, France, Germany and Hong Kong - Access Copyright provides instructors, staff and students with access to a growing repertoire of more than 20 million books, magazines, newspapers and other publications.

Under the licence you can:

- photocopy, fax, type and word process (without adaptation)
- make slides and overheads
- duplicate from a stencil
- copy onto microform (for research and archival purposes)

The licence covers only copying done in support of educational purposes and covers print copying only.

The Adult Language Learning licence has two main parts:

Part A Non-Coursepack Photocopying

The royalty for non-coursepack photocopying is based on the number of full-time equivalent (FTE) students in your school multiplied by the licence rate per student. The FTE is the total number of government funded seats contracted for the Program budget year. Coverage under the licence is extended to all instructors and staff.

Part A of the licence covers the following non-coursepack photocopying:

- one copy per student plus two for the instructor and as many as required for administrative purposes
- 10% of a publication or an entire essay, poem, article or short story may be copied
- an entire chapter that is 20% or less of a book may be copied
- an entire newspaper article or a page
- interlibrary loan

Systematic, cumulative copying is prohibited, which means that you may not copy 10% of a publication one day, then another 10% the next day, and so on until most or all of the publication is copied. There are no logging requirements for works copied under this part of the licence.



Part B Coursepacks

When compiling copies for sale or compilation, such as coursepacks, 15% of a published work may be copied. You can obtain permission to copy up to 15% - 25% of a work with a special clearance code from Access Copyright.

Specific restrictions also apply to the inclusion of textbook extracts into coursepacks:

- no more than 5% of a textbook, or one chapter
- a maximum of two extracts from textbooks written by the same author and published by the same publisher within any five year period
- no more than 50% of the pages in the coursepack can be taken from textbooks

All materials copied under Part B of the licence must be logged for payment per page or printed sheet copied. Licensees must provide full bibliographic information for the works copied under Part B of the licence so that royalty payments can be made directly to those copyright owners whose works are being copied.

Copying under the terms of Access Copyright's Adult Language Learning licence means you don't have to ask permission every time you need to photocopy something.
